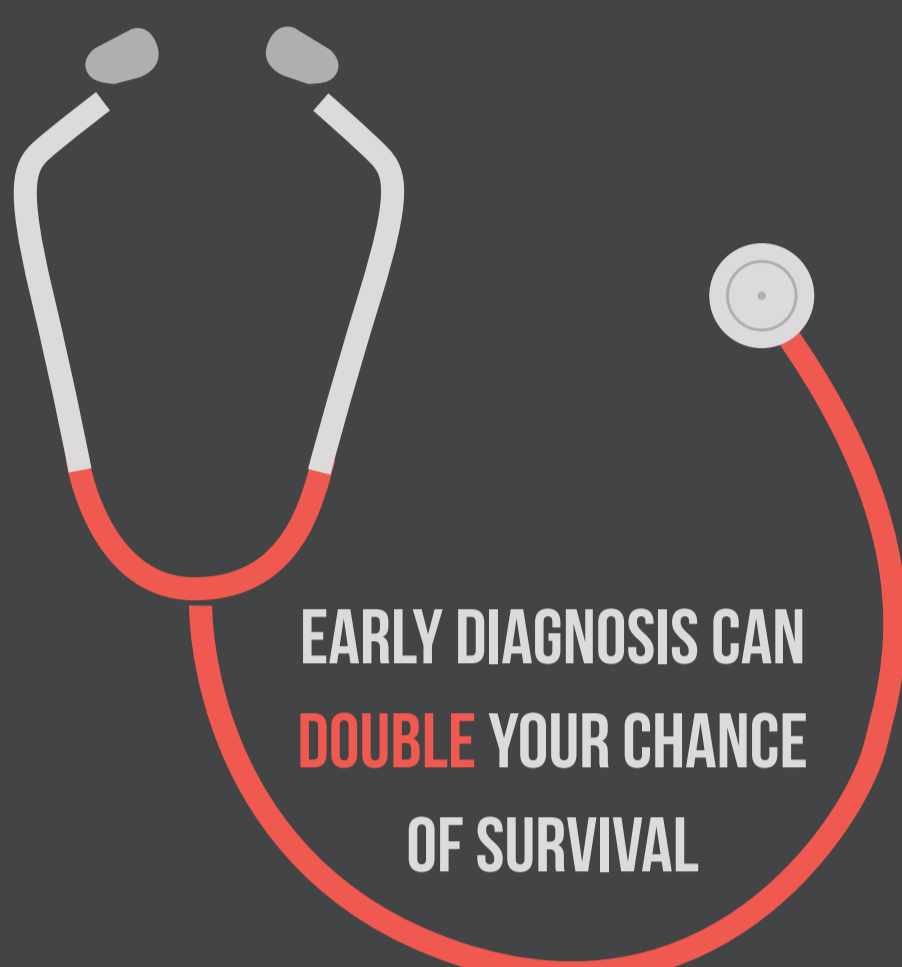
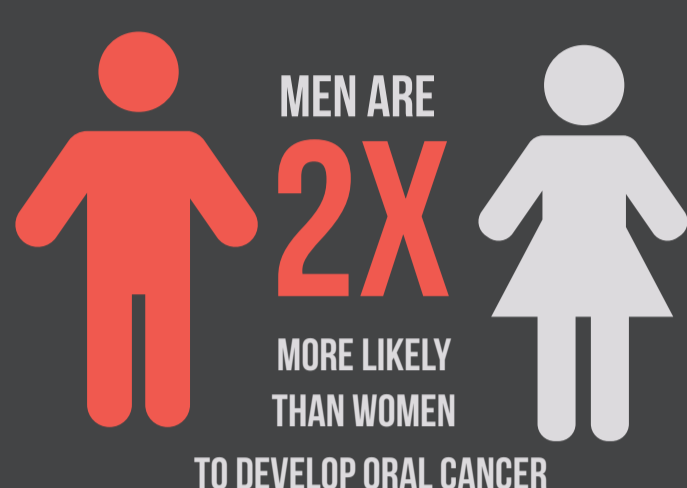

ONE AMERICAN DIES EVERY HOUR FROM ORAL CANCER



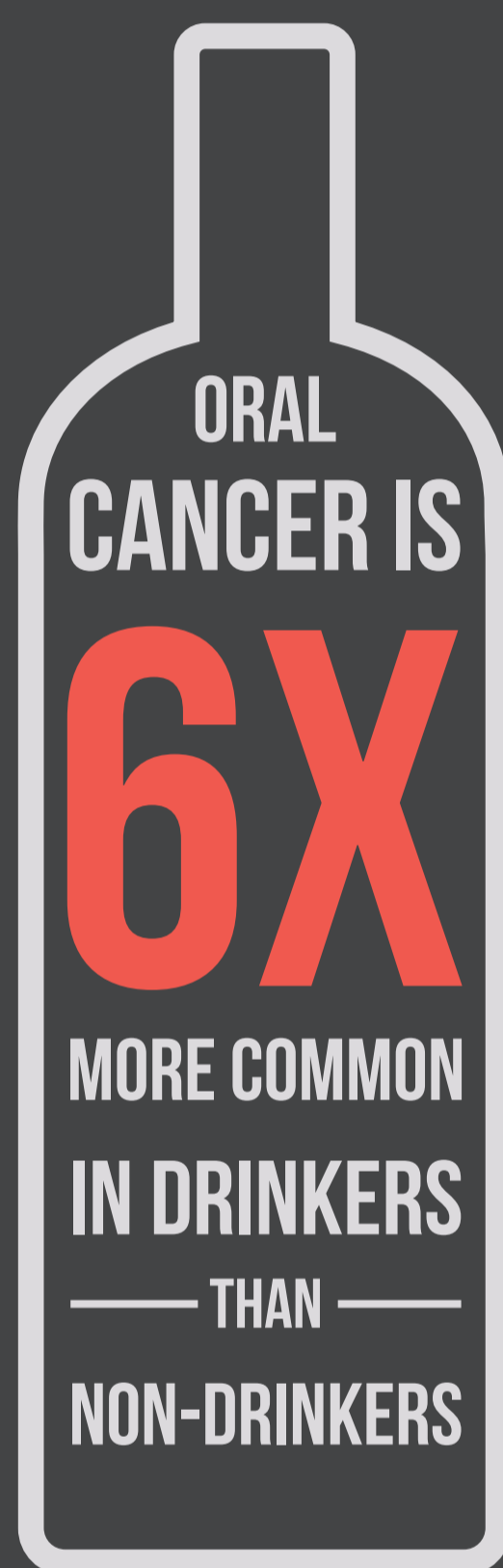
RISK FACTORS

25% OF ORAL CANCER PATIENTS HAVE NO RISK FACTORS
